

**WH Clegg (17 December 1920 to 31 December 1931)****W. H. Clegg - First Issue**

First notes issued by the South African Reserve Bank. The Ten Schilling note differed from the other denominations in watermark and in printing. It was a unilingual note with English and Dutch alternating every one hundred thousand notes. All the other denominations had English on the obverse and Dutch on the reverse with the printing on both sides in perfect "registration".

**W. H. Clegg - Second Issue**

In this issue the designs of the Ten Shilling, One Pound and Five Pound notes were changed and both sides of the notes were made bilingual with English predominating over Dutch.
