The main reasons for the issuing of the new note series are to upgrade the security features of which some are listed below:

- 1. Metallic / magnetic window security thread with the letters "SARB" visible when viewed against direct light.*
- 2. Invisible fluorescent fibres imbedded in paper (ultra - violet positive).*
- 3. Printed dots for identification by the blind.*

The practice of using replacement notes is discontinued.
