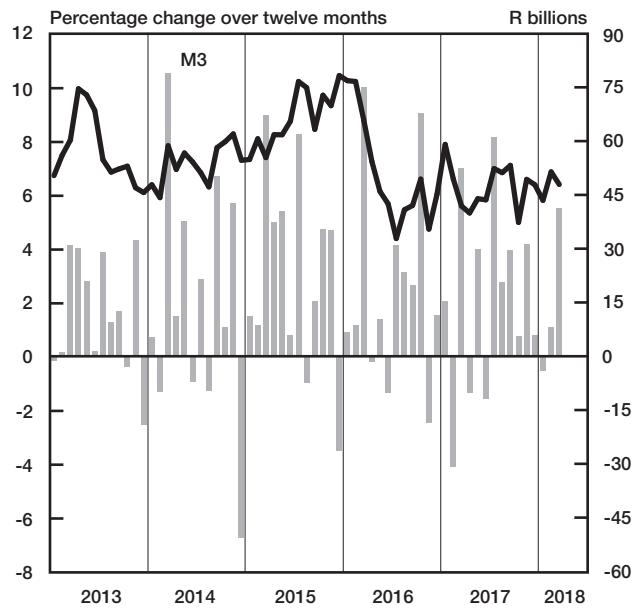

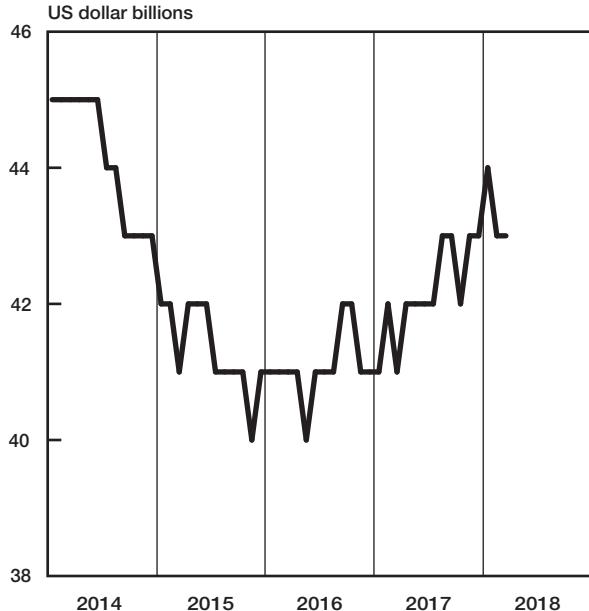

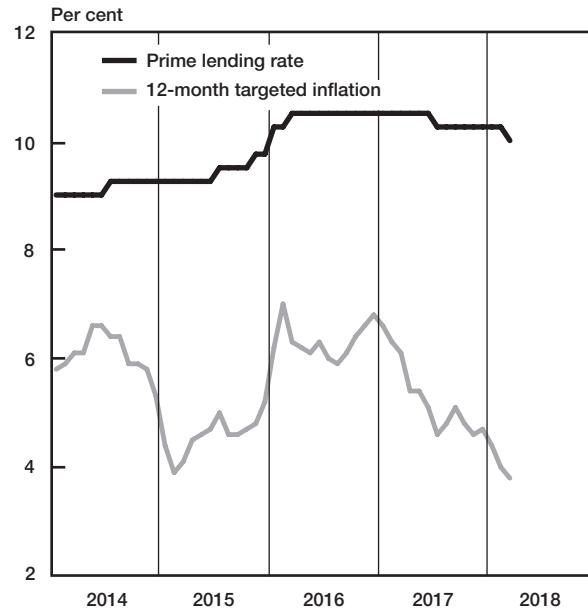

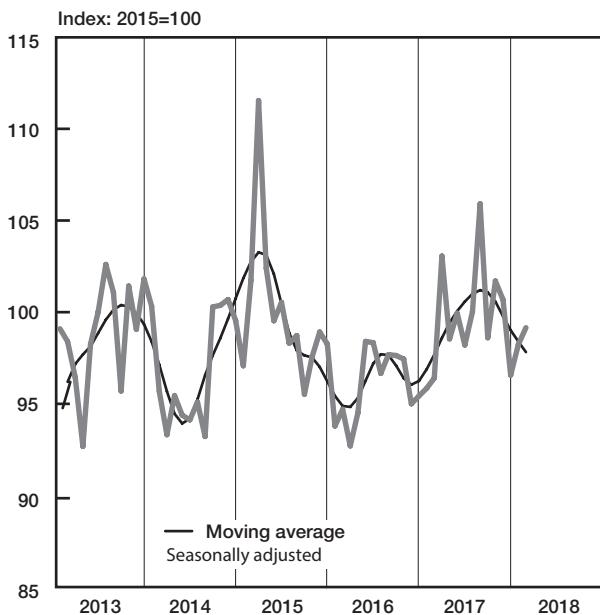
International liquidity position of the South African Reserve Bank



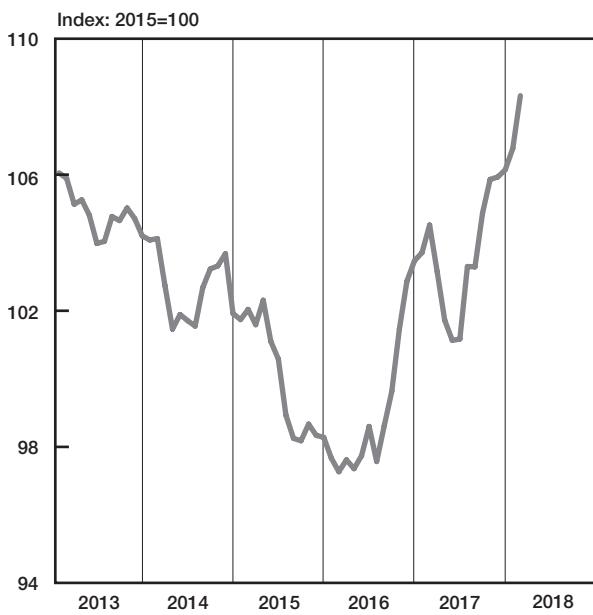
Prime lending rate and targeted inflation



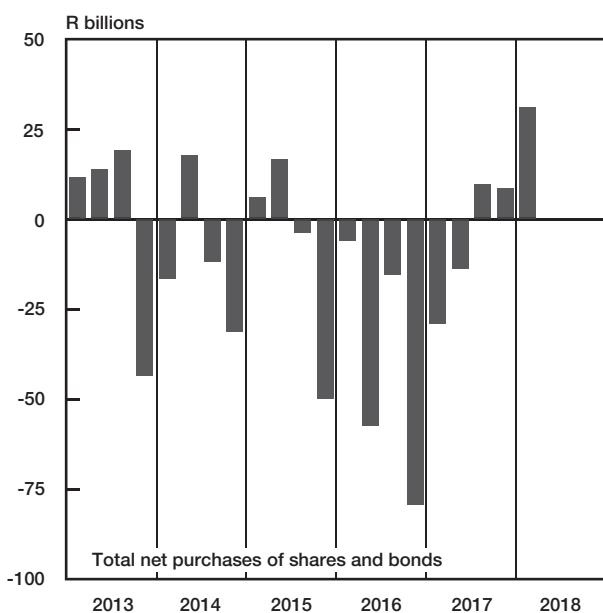
Physical volume of mining production: Total
